## <u>ITEM 4</u> <u>REPORTS/DISCUSSION ITEMS</u>

## L. Marchionda/N. Centritto

# i) <u>Discussion Panel - Parent Involvement Committee (PIC) Symposium</u>

N. Centritto and J. Hooper-Boyd provided an update on the April 20<sup>th</sup> - April 21<sup>st</sup> Symposium, held in Toronto. They attended the session on Saturday April 21<sup>st</sup> highlighting the following items of discussion:

- They learned, from various attendees, the Friday presentation was excellent;
- The felt Saturday's presentation/event was under whelming not as well rounded as in previous years;
- Majority of focus was on aboriginal education;
- event was not well attended;
- N. Centritto attended Child Youth Services workshop and J. Hooper-Boyd attended Child Family Centre workshop; and,
- Break out session to discuss PRO grants what works in schools and what doesn't work.

It was noted that this year's experience was not as informative or interactive as in previous years.

#### P. Daly

- P. Daly expressed his thanks to the Committee for their tremendous work and commitment to students and to Catholic education.
- P. Daly provided updates on the following:
- i) Our Lady of the Assumption Catholic Elementary School

The students entered the new building on Monday, April 30<sup>th</sup>. The official Blessing & Dedication is scheduled for Tuesday, June 12<sup>th</sup>.

#### ii) Renewing the Promise

Hard copy distributed to Committee for their information. All schools, Catholic School Councils, parishes etc. will be receiving a copy as well.

#### iii) <u>Election 2018</u>

Committee members are asked to share with parents that the Green Party's platform aims for the elimination of the Catholic school system. They support one school system.

#### D. Hansen

D. Hansen provided updates on the following:

## i) Provincial Assessment and reporting

The Ministry of Education announced a multi-year plan to give students and parents better information about a child's progress and modernize the curriculum and assessment tools from Kindergarten to Grade 12. Eighteen recommendations were released. Included in the recommendations were:

- Five recommendations regarding curriculum;
- Modernization of EQAO testing; and,
- Renewing of curriculum through the classroom and resources.

## ii) Mental Health Strategy

There is a three-tier outline of interventions:

- Tier 1: Promotion support for all students;
- Tier 2: Prevention support for 15-20% of students; and,
- Tier 2: Intervention support for 2-5% of students

Suicide intervention, bullying and student voice depend greatly on, but not exclusive to:

- Teacher/student relationships;
- Ongoing discussion not only during 'Mental Health Week'; and
- Christian meditation

## iii) <u>Transition</u>

The Board supports the work experience program and will continue to support transitions of students with special education needs to community, post-secondary, volunteer, or work through the supported workplace experience program with the assistance of a transition coordinator and job coaches.

# iv) <u>Director's Awards of Excellence for Elementary Students</u>

During Catholic Education, week recipients of the Director's Awards of Excellence for Elementary Students were invited to the Fr. Kyran Kennedy Catholic Education Centre to receive a certificate of recognition and a group photo with the Director of Education. This year 591 students received awards.

## v) <u>Director's Award for Outstanding Dedication to Students and Staff</u>

The Director's Awards for Outstanding Dedication to Students and Staff were held on Wednesday, May 16, 2018. This year's ceremony recognized 79 staff members from all job categories and all areas of the Board.
