P.01 – Catholic School Council – PROCEDURES

- 1. The Board shall seek input from Catholic School Councils in a number of areas including:
 - a) the development or revision of Board policies and guidelines with respect to:
 - the code of conduct;
 - appropriate dress for pupils in school;
 - the allocation of funding for School Councils;
 - the process and criteria for the selection of Principals and Vice-Principals
 - fund raising activities of School Councils;
 - conflict resolution processes for internal School Council disputes; and
 - reimbursement of expenses incurred by members and officers of School Councils
 - b) the accountability of the education system to parents;
 - c) Board action plans for student improvement, based on test results from the Education Quality and Accountability Office.
- 2. The Board shall consider and respond to recommendations made by the Catholic School Councils.
- 3. As a member of the Catholic School Council a principal shall attend council meetings to seek input from the council and communicate with the school community.
- 4. A Catholic School Council shall meet at least four times during the school year.
- 5. The Board shall provide the Catholic School Council, through the Board's website, a list of Board and Standing Committee meeting dates.
- 6. Superintendents of Education shall provide each school within their jurisdiction the prescribed Catholic School Council Guidelines.
- 7. Annually, the Principal shall invite parents to participate in the school's Catholic School Council.
- 8. Each year, the principal shall review the Catholic School Council Guidelines with the newly elected members of the council.
- 9. The Catholic School Council shall develop by-laws that govern the operation of the Council.
- 10. The Catholic School Council shall annually submit a written report on its activities including fundraising activities [where applicable] to the principal and the board through the Superintendent of Education.
- 11. The principal shall provide a copy of the annual report to every parent of a pupil enrolled in the school.
