S.M.20 Administration of Prescribed Medication

POLICY STATEMENT:

In accordance with Ministry of Education Policy / Program Memorandum No. 81- Provision of Health Supports in School Settings, 1984 where a student has been prescribed medication by a physician or nurse practitioner and the medication must be taken during school hours and/or during related activities and the parent/guardian of the student and/or the adult student has given informed, written consent, the principal/designate shall supervise the administration of the medication.

The Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board is aware that some students who attend its schools require the administration of prescribed medication during school hours and/or during school related activities in order to successfully access the curriculum.

In addressing the needs of students who are required to take prescribed medications during school hours, the Board shall make every reasonable effort to:

- support students to fully access school in a safe, accepting and healthy learning environment which enhances their mental, physical and spiritual well-being; and,
- empower students, as confident and capable learners, to reach their full potential for self-management of their medical condition;
- ensure the school board personnel are aware of which students within the school population require prescription medication, subject to parent/guardian and adult consent; and,
- outline the procedures necessary to intervene effectively in the event that a student reacts to his/her prescribed medication.

In the case of a prescription for medical cannabis, only cannabis oils, capsules or edibles may be administered on school premises. In accordance with the Smoke - Free Ontario Act, 2017, the smoking or vaping of medical cannabis is prohibited.
