Fire Code

Some of the common Fire Code infractions we see CUS users:

- Blocking exits with tables, equipment etc.
- Blocking fire extinguishers
- Furniture in Hallways



Fire Contraventions

- ▣ Contravention of the Ontario Fire Code may result in prosecution and fines for the Board, The Director of Education and / or the individual liable of the offence such you as a CUS user.
- ▣ An individual convicted of an offence is liable to a fine of not more than \$50,000 or imprisonment for a term of not more than one year, or both.
- ▣ A corporation convicted of an offence is liable to a fine of not more than \$100,000.
- ▣ A Director or Officer of a corporation who knows that the corporation is violating or has violated a provision of the Ontario Fire Code and convicted of an offence is liable to a fine of not more than \$50,000 or to imprisonment for a term of not more than one year, or to both. 2005

New CUS Responsibilities

- ▣ The HWCDSB's Fire Plan was approved on July 25th 2016.
- ▣ New to the plan were CUS responsibilities which include:
 - Kim will ensure a copy of the Fire Plan is on the CUS website. Users electronically sign off they have read it and shared it with their groups;
 - A representative from each CUS organization must attend the annual CUS training and must share the content of the program with all users;
 - CUS users must create their own fire plans for their events include plans for persons with disabilities;
 - CUS users must have a form of communication at all times in order to call 911.

Critical Injury Reporting

Notice of death or injury (OHSA)

51. (1) Where a “person” is killed or critically injured:

- from any cause at a workplace, the employer shall notify the Mol immediately.
- A “person” includes a visitor, student, contractor, parent or staff person.



Definition

O. Reg. 834/90 defines a critical injury as life threatening events that result in a:

- *Loss of consciousness;*
- *Substantial loss of blood;*
- *A fractured leg or arm; but not finger or toe*
- *Loss of leg, arm, hand or foot; but not finger or toe*
- *Burns to the majority of a human body; and*
- *Loss of vision.*

Preservation of wreckage

(2) Where a person is killed or is critically injured at a workplace, no person shall, destroy, alter or carry away any wreckage, article or thing at the scene of or connected with the occurrence until permission so to do has been given by an inspector.

R.S.O. 1990, c. O.1, s.51
